

On a recent trip to Ireland, which reportedly has large shale gas reserves but also has some of the most picturesque countryside in the world, fracking is a divisive subject. Although Ireland has a current account surplus, nearly all of the money that is brought into the country through tourism is spent on importing energy from elsewhere. 

Brussels is not considering the possibility to suggest introducing a pan-EU ban on controversial shale gas but has called on member states to continue focusing on renewable energy resources, European Commissioner for Environment Janez Potočnik says.

In an interview with BNS following a discussion with EU environment ministers in Vilnius, the commissioner said that the European Commission would present a proposal on ways to ensure environmental standards during shale gas exploitation but the scope of regulation was not decided yet.

Poland's shale gas business is facing a serious challenge after the EU's highest court ruled that Warsaw violated European law by allowing licences to be issued for the exploration and extraction of hydrocarbons, without fully open tenders.

The European Court of Justice ruling, issued on 27 June, affects around 100 shale gas exploration licences issued by Warsaw to firms which were accompanied by production permits that had not been put out to tender, in breach of the EU's Hydrocarbon Directive.

The ruling could have grave consequences for Poland, Polish news media reported, with the country's current policy aimed at protecting exploration licence holders' interests by issuing subsequent production licences without tenders.

Friends of the Earth hailed the ruling as "a massive setback" for Poland's shale gas industry, which would delay the roll-out of new drills and allow more time for the European Commission to draw up environmental legislation. (...)

(...) **A quiet retirement gets fracked**

I retired with no intention of doing anything in the oil or gas industries. [But] about the time we bought this house and started restoration, people that knew I had been in the oil business started saying, what do you think about fracking? I had not been following it at all, and said, 'What do you mean?' " They said, 'They're talking about maybe drilling gas wells 100 or 150 feet from the lake.' I said, "That's crazy. It doesn't make any sense, I'll see what I can find out." (...)

EC: So what's the solution?

LA: I think we have wasted a lot of time that should have gone into seriously looking into and developing alternative energies. And we need to stop wasting that time and get going on it. We've all seen the results in states across the country of the influence that the American Legislative Exchange Council and the Koch Brothers have amassed. And if you think the results of their agenda to hand more and more power to corporations at your expense are bad, you should really hate the new "trade" deals being negotiated to hand even more power to corporations at our expense.

The Transpacific Partnership (TPP) is being secretly negotiated by 12 countries, including the

EPA to Allow Consumption of Toxic Fracking Wastewater by Wildlife and Livestock

Millions of gallons of water laced with toxic chemicals from oil and gas drilling rigs are pumped for consumption by wildlife and livestock with the formal approval from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), according to public comments filed yesterday by Public Employees for Environmental Responsibility (PEER). Contrary to its own regulations, EPA is issuing permits for surface application of drilling wastewater without even identifying the chemicals in fluids used for hydraulic fracturing, also known as fracking, let alone setting effluent limits for the contaminants contained within them.

Energy chiefs warn on EU oil sands measures

Chief executives of some of Britain's largest energy service companies have warned of "significant economic consequences" if Brussels implements [a fuel quality directive](#) that would classify [crude from Canada's oil sands](#) as dirtier than other types.

The executives – who include Samir Brikho of [Amec](#), Keith Cochrane of [Weir Group](#) and Bob Keiller of [Wood Group](#) – point out in a letter to the Financial Times that their companies are part of a European supply chain that benefits from [the development of Canada's oil sands industry](#).

The fuel quality directive was passed in 2007, but agreement has yet to be reached on how certain articles will be enforced. The EU's Climate Commissioner, Connie Hedegaard, is expected to publish the results of an impact assessment of the proposed implementation measures before the end of August.

Joe Oliver, Canada's natural resources minister, visited Europe this year to lobby on behalf of the industry. He claimed the proposed implementation measures unfairly singled out crude from oil sands and did not take into account emissions from countries that are less transparent in reporting their emissions than Canada.

The executives, while supporting the goal of the directive to reduce the carbon intensity of energy supplied for road transport, claim the implementation measures might "have the perverse outcome of penalising the Canadian oil sands for

transparency of disclosure relating to greenhouse gas emissions from this crude source”.

“As members of the European supply chain to Canada’s energy sector, this could have significant economic consequences... Now, more than ever, energy security and energy affordability are paramount to ensure energy competitiveness,” they added.

Oil sands, a sticky mixture of sand, water and bitumen, have become an [important source of wealth](#) for Canada but are also a major target for environmental activists. Environmentalists [oppose oil sands](#) because they say there are already more than enough known reserves of fossil fuels to heat the planet to potentially dangerous levels.

They also argue the energy-intensive extraction techniques required to get fuel from oil sands – dubbed as tar sands by critics – produces more greenhouse gas emissions than other types of crude, while a pipeline spill could harm native wildlife.

Once the measures in the fuel quality directive have been formally published, there will be a period of two months for the member states – in the form of the Council of Ministers – to approve or reject it. The decisive vote could happen as soon as mid-October when the EU’s environment ministers are due to meet.

[Osborne looks to create world’s most generous shale tax regime](#)

George Osborne will pledge on Friday to create the world’s most generous tax regime for shale gas as he attempts to galvanise the revolutionary industry in Britain.

The UK chancellor will cut the tax on shale production to 30 per cent compared with the 62 per cent paid by most of the oil and gas industry in a move that will be warmly greeted by operators.

At the same time, the Treasury will insist energy companies must provide at least £100,000 of community benefits for each well drilled by the industry.

Ministers are keen to replicate the success of the US, where “fracking” has produced a glut of natural gas and pushed down the price to the benefit of households and industry. David Cameron said recently that he was “pretty jealous” of the US industry.

Yet there is growing concern from environmentalists about the consequences of fracking – or hydraulic fracturing – which involves pumping water, sand and chemicals underground to split the rock and release the gas or oil inside.

Green groups fear that the process can pollute ground water and release the greenhouse gas methane into the atmosphere.

Mr Osborne will say that shale gas has “huge potential” to broaden Britain’s energy mix, create thousands of jobs and keep energy bills low.

"Shale gas is a resource with huge potential to broaden the UK's energy mix," he plans to say. "We want to create the right conditions for industry to explore and unlock that potential in a way that allows communities to share in the benefits."

[A recent report by the British Geological Survey revealed there is more than twice as much shale gas in the north of England than there was thought previously to be in the entire country.](#)

Michael Fallon, energy minister, told parliament on Thursday that Britain still required oil and gas for three-quarters of its energy needs. "It is a vital part of our economy, and it is going to remain so for decades to come, even as we move to a low-carbon economy," he said.

Mr Fallon said that onshore oil and gas had been extracted successfully in the UK for a century without any chemical spills or gas leakages "comparable to the experience in the US".

The minister said gas prices had halved in the US as a result of fracking, which was now being explored by India and China.

But Tom Greatrex, shadow energy minister, said there was no proof that there would be the same impact on energy prices in Britain.

While expressing cautious support for shale gas, Mr Greatrex said: "Suggestions there is going to be cheap gas to extrapolate the US experience doesn't stand up to much scrutiny, given the way gas is traded."

Ministers will set out a system of regulatory oversight for shale gas with the Environment Agency, responsible for ground water, and the Health and Safety Executive, in charge of wells.

The coalition faces a potential backlash from MPs of all parties amid some public hostility to fracking. Tessa Munt, Liberal Democrat MP for Wells, cited "pollution incidents in the US and Australia" as she welcomed the unanimous cross-party opposition to fracking from councillors in Bath and northeast Somerset.
